

2023 Spring SCHÜTZENFEST,

Including the Washington Outdoor International Rifle
Championships – June 3 & 4, 2023
Sponsored by Tacoma Rifle & Revolver Club

I - INTRODUCTION

This two-day tournament combines two very different events:

Saturday: The 2023 Washington Outdoor International Rifle Championships, a 40-40-40 full course. NRA-registered and WSR&PA-sanctioned. WSRPA memberships are required.

Sunday: An outdoor 100-shot offhand match. Any rifle, either iron- or any-sights. This is not a registered match...intended to be a fun match.

II - INFORMATION APPLICABLE TO BOTH EVENTS AND BOTH DAYS

RANGE: See map on this program. Facilities include rest rooms, picnic area and overnight parking with limited electric hookups for RVs (no water or sewer) and plenty of room for tents. There are no lunch facilities, but fast food places are nearby on Bridgeport Way. Shooters will be required to sign a TR&RC liability waiver form, unless one is on file. *Upon arrival at the gate, push the <u>big black button</u> and the gate will open for you. Ditto when exiting.*

ENTRY: ADVANCE ENTRY IS REQUESTED. Via or contact Jim Greeves, by e-mail: jjjjgr@comcast.net (360)528-0503. Enter by e-mail, provide your name NRA 3-position classifications and your category and what days you want to shot. Entries are limited to 54 competitors each day. WHEN SIGNING UP FOR THE MATCH, PLEASE INDICATE RELY 1 OR RELY 2: Rely 1 will start at 9:00am, Rely 2 will start approx. 1:30pm. Relay 1 will shoot all stages of the match followed by Relay 2 starts. Depending on the number of signups, we may combine into on relay

ENTRY FEES: Package entry fee for Saturday is \$33 (includes WSRPA surcharge); the entry fee for Sunday is \$20. Package entry fee for whole weekend is \$45. Make checks payable to TR&R. These figures include sales tax, as follows

SCORING & CHALLENGES: Targets will be scored using Orion scoring system. Scored targets will not be displayed, but may be examined upon request. The challenge fee is \$2.00, refundable for sustained challenges. The Statistical Office is closed to all competitors except when a score is being challenged. Use of the scoring plug is restricted to stat officers and the Jury Chairman.

GENERAL: Shooting starts at 9:00 AM each day. Squadding assignments will be made each morning. Coaching will not be permitted. All rifles must be loaded and fired single-shot. There is no team match. A list of motels is available on request. Competitors will hang targets and backers.... <u>BRING YOUR TARGET CLIPS!</u>

III - INFORMATION FOR WASHINGTON OUTDOOR INTERNATIONAL RIFLE CHAMPIONSHIPS, SATURDAY, JUNE 3, 2023

RULES: Current NRA smallbore rifle rules and NRA A-51 targets will be used. Rule 3.2 ("Any Rifle") will apply. Orion Scoring may be used. Coaching will not be permitted. **BRING TARGET CLIPS! EYE PROTECTION IS REQUIRED**

ELIGIBILITY: Open to individual NRA members and non-members alike. Washington residents, including juniors and Washington-based military, must be WSR&PA members. Memberships will be available at the registration counter. Non-residents need not be WSR&PA members.

CLASSIFICATION: Competitors must use their current outdoor metric 3-position classification. Temporary classifications (rule 19.14) and assigned classifications (rule 19.6) may also be used. Unclassified competitors will fire in the Master Class. For award purposes, a class with fewer than 3 competitors will be combined with the next higher class.

COURSE OF FIRE: Shooting begins at 9:00 AM. 3-position full course, with the qualifying scores in each event reported to the NRA

Match Schedule:

- 1. 40 shots Kneeling
- 2. 40 shots Prone
- 3. 40 shots Standing

4. Full course aggregate

STATE CHAMPIONSHIP: The highest scoring Washington residents in Match 4 will be the State Champions. Junior and Senior State Champions will also be recognized, provided there are at least three entries in those categories, with a limit of one of these special state championships for any individual competitor. State Championship designations may be added to other awards.

AWARDS: Medals, trophies or equivalent cash will be awarded in all matches, according to the match awards schedule. Awards will go to the high senior, high Junior, high Intermediate junior and high sub-junior in Match 4, *provided there are at least three entries in each of those categories*. Award priority will be Open, Special and Class awards, in that order, with awards passed down so that no competitor wins more than one award per match.

IV - INFORMATION FOR 100-SHOT OFFHAND MATCH SUNDAY, JUNE 4, 2023

RULES: Although this match is not sanctioned, the current NRA Smallbore Rifle Rules will apply. The A-33 100-yard target will be used. Rules 3.2 (*Any rifle*) and 3.7c (*any sights*) will apply.

ELIGIBILITY: Open to any shooter....

CLASS / CATEGORY: NRA (or other) classifications will not be used. Shooters will be divided into any-sight and iron-sight divisions, each division to be further divided according to age categories: Sub-Junior, Intermediate Junior, Junior (all three as NRA-defined), Prime (ages 21-30), Veteran (ages 31-40), Sub-Senior (ages 41-50), Senior (ages 51-60) and Experienced (ages 61+). Each category must have at least two shooters; those without this minimum will be combined with other categories at the Match Director's discretion.

MATCH SCHEDULE: All shooters will fire five 20-shot stages, 35-minute time limit. There will be a 15-minute target change (and relay change, if needed) period between fired stages.

AWARDS: The top finisher in the iron- and any-sight divisions will receive a special award, regardless of their age category. The top shooter in each category will receive an award; second place will be awarded if there are 5 or more shooters in a category. Awards can be either TR&R medallions, NRA Award Points or cash.
